


- is often found in hilly and mountainous areas north of the equator
- feeds on camcams, miras, and other fruits
- mates for life
- can have two or three broods per year, but usually has one; often gives birth to twins, but one of the twins usually dies
- is noted for its beautiful blue fur

## CRESTED CRABBIT

- is noted for its shiny purple crest feathers
  - lays two eggs every other year
    feeds on white-backed sand crabs
  - huge flocks gather during the mating season
  - nests in rough-barked pine trees along



## GREEN GOOR

- lives in streams and marshesfeeds on fish, eggs, tadpoles, and
- aquatic insects; especially fond of mosquito larvae
- hibernates in clusters in the mud during cold months
- lays an average of five eggs each year; eggs are sensitive to pesticide poisoning
- has been introduced into other areas to help control mosquitoes
